Bishop,

As members of Synod will know from recently held Easter Vestry Meetings, this is a triennial

year, meaning that at Diocesan Synods during the months ahead there will be elections to

membership for the next session of General Synod.

As current members of the General Synod we should have completed a Declaration Form as

required under the Church of Ireland's Constitution Chapter 1, Part 1 Section 9 stating that as

of the 1st January previous we were between the ages of 17 and 73 years inclusive and that we

are communicant members of the Church of Ireland. As part of this Form of Declaration we

will have included our signature and our date of birth and these forms were forwarded by

diocesan offices to the Synod Officer.

In today's world, a most convenient means of communication is electronic mail. Already much

of our Synod correspondence is by electronic mail, therefore in order to assist the Synod Officer

to communicate with General Synod members, by way of Bill No. 4, the Honorary Secretaries

are simply requesting that an email address is offered by elected members on their Declaration

Form, so that a database of addresses can more be easily compiled for the next and future

sessions of General Synod. Naturally email addresses will be managed in a GDPR-compliant

fashion.
