'Missio Dei literally means the 'mission of God.' For the last few decades, this Latin

phrase has reminded the church that mission is God's idea, not ours. Mission flows out

of his nature, not our need. In fact, God is the first missionary. The Father sends the Son

into the world. The Father and the Son then send the Spirit. Finally, the church is sent

in the power of the Spirit into the world. We join his mission. All of our missional

activities flow out of the reality that God is a missionary.'
