able to start the recovery process for children's ministry and youth work.

development and growth, and assessing its impact post-pandemic, and like many others in their

fields, CIYD wants to assess the youth ministry landscape across the Church of Ireland and

what that currently looks like with accurate research, data and stats.

With Next Steps we aim to significantly encourage the number of young people and current

youth leaders to undertake third level professional qualifications and development within the

wider youth ministry sector, the impact of which would benefit ministry in the Church of

Ireland.

This fund provides individuals with significant bursaries to encourage them in their application

for relevant third level undergraduate and post graduate courses in relation to youth ministry.
